



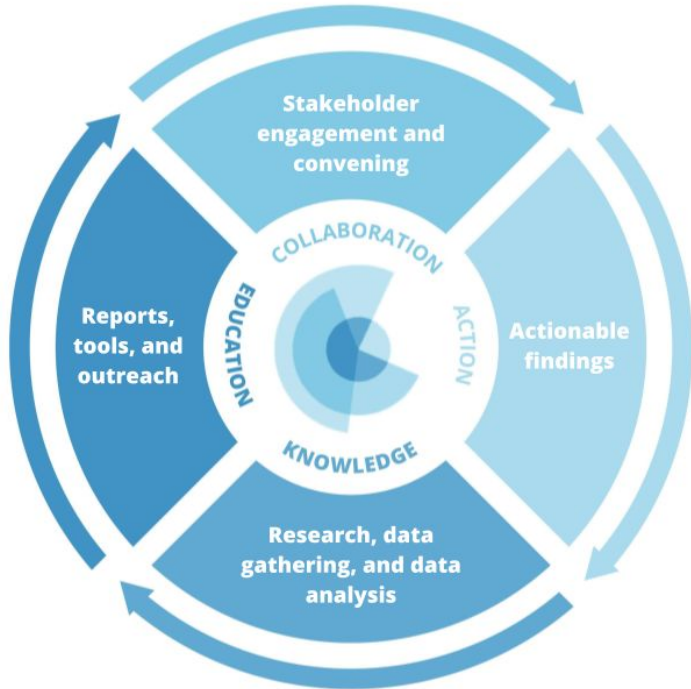

Action-oriented resources to help government, industry, and the public utilize data.

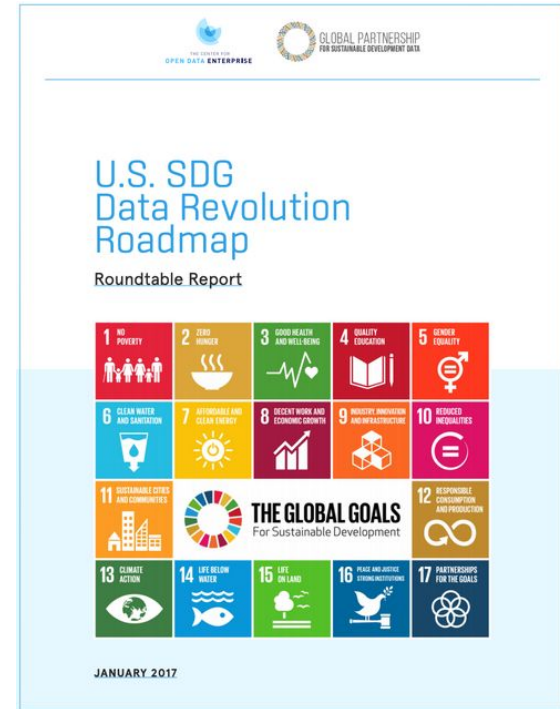
CODE and the SDGs

- **Open SDG**
 - Joint project with US government and UK Office of National Statistics
 - Open source SDG data management
 - 23 countries and 11 localities
- **SDG National Reporting Initiative**
 - Provides information for governments and IOs on key SDG policy and technical considerations



CODE and the SDGs

- **U.S. SDG Data Revolution Roadmap**
 - Co-hosted Roundtable with the Global Partnership for Sustainable Development Data (GPSDD)
 - 40 stakeholders from government, civil society, private sector
 - Identified challenges, priorities, and commitments for U.S. Federal government



CODE'S Open Data Roundtables

Purpose: Convene experts from inside and outside of government, identify strategic challenges and opportunities in applying their data, and develop ways to improve data collection, use, and management.

- Engage key stakeholders in important data topics
- Build coalitions and networks for collaboration
- Catalyze research and new initiatives on emerging open data topics
- Develop action-oriented recommendations for technical, cultural, and legal challenges around open data
